## TARRANT COUNTY COLLEGE DISTRICT

Meeting of the Board of Trustees March 22, 2018 6:00 p.m.

- 1. <u>Call to Order.</u> The Board of Trustees conducted its regular monthly meeting on Thursday, March 22, 2018 in the District Offices, May Owen Center, with Mrs. Louise Appleman presiding. Other trustees present were Mr. Greenhill, Dr. Gwen Morrison, Mr. Conrad Heede, Dr. Diane Patrick and Dr. Michael Evans. Also present were Chancellor Giovannini and members of the TCCD staff.
- 2. Public Comment. None.
- 3. Board Action Items and Board Business Related Items.

On a motion by Dr. Michael Evans, seconded by Mr. Conrad Heede, the minutes for February 15, 2018 were unanimously approved as presented.

Mrs. Appleman also mentioned the different Women's History Month events that took place on some of the campuses. Mrs. Appleman mentioned the Mrs. Ayala attended the Women in STEM ceremony event at Trinity River campus. South campus held a Women's History Month symposium, who had DeSoto Mayor Curtistene Smith McCowan speak to the group, and Mayor Betsy Price spoke to the group at Trinity River Connect campus for their Women's History Month event as well. Also on Thursday, March 22, 2018 The Texas Tribune hosted - Conversations with Representative Nicole Collier and Matt Krause at the Trinity River campus.

Mr. Heede is TCC's representative on the Foundation board. He spoke briefly on a conference he attended along with the TCC Board Foundation Members. A couple points Mr. Heede mentioned was there was a consensus that TCC Board Members and TCC Board of Foundations should be more aligned. One of the suggestions was to re-examine the MOU in place, which the foundation board has started and the TCC board members will also look into. One of the topics discussed was Investments on the foundations funds and college funds. Going forward, the mineral funds' investments that were transferred to the foundation, will be invested under the new guidelines and new law using Northern Trust. 100 percent monies earned are dedicated to TCC Student Scholarships. Mr. Heede also mentioned the Foundation is working on the fourth stage of the strategic plan, they are narrowing it down to three areas that the Foundation will be working on.

5. <u>College Presentation.</u> Dr. Tony Roberts, Professor of Philosophy and World Religions, NW Campus presented:

Faculty Strategies in Preparing the Future Workforce: Critical Thinking.

Dr. Tony Roberts, Professor of Philosophy and Religion on the Northwest Campus addressed the board and audience regarding the nature, value, and practice of critical thinking. Using neuroscience and actual class assignments from across the district, in a variety of courses, he demonstrated how the enhancement of these practices at TCC has moved/is moving us toward successful student learning outcomes, is supported by the 3 goals and 8 principles of the TCC plan for excellent, and ensures that the college is contributing successfully to the THECB 60x30 benchmarks for increasing the number of completers who have "marketable skills" (critical thinking being at the top of the CCHA, THECB, AACU lists of necessary learning outcomes). "TCC is shifting the narrative of educational theory away from TEACHING critical thinking (as a specific skill) to ENHANCING critical thinking PATHWAYS (that already exist in our brains and in our social attachments)."

- 15. <u>Consideration and Approval of Contract with Insight Public Sector to Provide Information</u>
  <u>Security Assessment. **Amount \$148,149.94.**</u> On a motion by Mr. Heede, seconded by Dr. Evans, this contract was unanimously approved.
- 16. Monthly Financial Report Information. Dr. Mark McClendon reported the financials for the 6th month of the year and looking at expenditures greater than 60 percent. Income is at 85.8 percent with everything being as expected and most taxed monies have been received so far. Expenditures with an increase, that have not been mentioned before, are Tax Administration & Collection which is at 91 percent due to our taxes being paid of \$1.6 million and higher Unemployment Compensation costs which has brought us up to 71 percent. Looking at total expenditures, we are at 51 percent. Investments Pools with less than one day have increased to \$7.1 million dollars The term that was used by the TCC Foundation is now called Beneficial Interests in Funds Held by Affiliate and now show NA for the Yield. This was changed to match the language used in the annual audit report to reflect the majority of these funds are now invested in equities (stock) with no maturity or yield. Short Term there is no activity. Agencies, we have purchased 2 \$10 million Federal National Mortgage Association securities. Total Portfolio have increased \$26 million to an ending balance of \$408.6 million. Yield as of 2/28/2018 is 1.53 percent and WAM is 354 days.
