You Deserve Credit for What You Have Earned!

No application fee. No transfer fee. No repeating courses.

We accept every credit in your associate's degree. Start with your associate's degree or close to 60 credit hours and finish sooner.

If you have earned your associate's degree:

Your associate's degree will fulfill the 36 credit hour General Education Core Curriculum requirement for your bachelor's degree. Enrolling with ALL of the credits in your associate's degree will also cover a significant amount of elective requirements. If you need additional credits, we recommend that you complete them at your current college.

If you have accumulated close to 60 credit hours:

An admissions counselor at Bellevue University will work with you to develop a preliminary degree completion plan. This process includes reviewing any credits previously earned to determine how they will be applied toward your major, general education or elective requirements.

If you have some credits, but not enough to start the major courses in your bachelor's degree program:

At Bellevue University, we recommend you complete your associate's degree or about 60 credit hours at your current college before entering a degree program. Accelerated degree courses start at the upper division, so preliminary coursework is required. If you wish to pursue courses in a traditional program of study, completion of 60 credits is still recommended. Completing general education core requirements and needed electives at your current college saves you time and money because all of your credits will transfer.

If you have not earned an associate's degree, or have fewer than 60 credits, your Bellevue University Admissions Counselor will complete a preliminary degree plan showing which requirements you've met, and which courses you will need to complete. Individual courses will only transfer if they are college level, with a grade of C or better.

The In-class Experience

If you're near our 46-acre main campus or one of our ten other locations, you can choose to take classes on site. Small class sizes allow for personal attention from professors and an opportunity to communicate with your peers, share valuable experience and build relationships. Start with an associate's degree or about 60 credit hours **60** hours

Complete a 40 credit hour cohort major **40** hours

Every bachelor's degree student completes The Kirkpatrick Signature Series, a 9-credit hour series unique to Bellevue University, considered essential learning for adults in America today **9** hours

Complete 18 credit hours of electives (for the most efficient tuition rate, we suggest you complete these at your college.) Enrolling with your associate's degree will cover all – or a significant amount – of your elective requirements. Also, ask about applying CLEP, DSST, military, and/or corporate training credits toward your requirements **18** hours

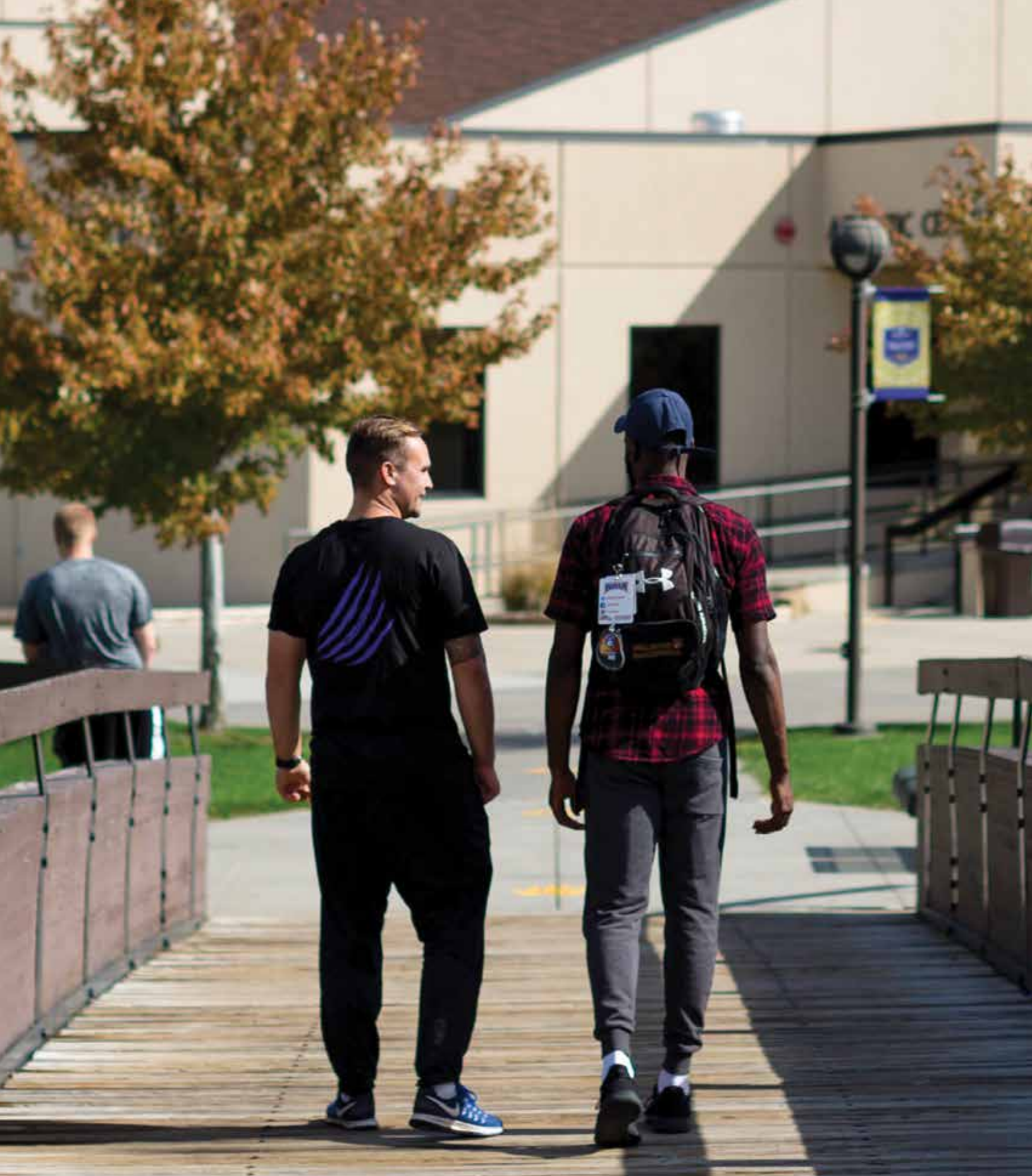
Whether you're learning on campus or online, you'll have full access to the extensive resources and support of the Freeman/Lozier Library.
